

APS MEMBER ARTICLE PACKS Online License Agreement

This Agreement is between the American Physical Society (APS) and the Licensee. APS grants a license for access to APS Member Article Packs, subject to the Terms and Conditions set forth in paragraphs 1 to 5 below.

APS Member Article Packs allow the user to download articles from Physical Review Journals and Physical Review Online Archive (PROLA).

Please read the following Terms and Conditions. By clicking the “agree to” button at the bottom of the page you agree to abide by all these Terms and Conditions.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Scope of License - Personal Use Restrictions. The license permits online access by the individual licensee from any site through the use of one (1) User-ID and password issued by APS.

- a. An APS Member Article Pack is a bulk discount purchase of articles from *Physical Review A, B, C, D, E, Letters* or PROLA. *Reviews of Modern Physics* is not included. Any downloaded full-text article will be debited from the licensee’s Article Pack. The licensee’s Article Pack will remain active for one full year in coordination with the licensee’s APS membership term. Members are allowed one (1) Pack per membership term. During this time the licensee will maintain full access to all downloaded articles and may select new articles with any unused portion of the licensee’s Article Pack.
- b. The licensee may browse and search the Licensed Journal(s).
- c. The licensee may make one hard copy of the selected articles from the Licensed Journal(s).
- d. The licensee may download individual articles or portions of such articles, to hard disk or similar storage device, but these materials may not be posted to a publicly accessible website. In all cases the downloaded or printed articles may be used only for one’s own information or research and may not be sold.

Licensees acknowledge they have no claim to ownership of the APS Licensed Journal(s).

The APS reserves the right to suspend and/or terminate access to APS Licensed Journal(s) without prior notice if the licensee violates any term of this Agreement.

2. Responsibility. The licensee is solely responsible for any use of the User-ID and password, whether or not authorized, to access any APS Licensed Journal(s). Unauthorized use of the licensee's User-ID and password to access the APS Licensed Journal(s) with or without the licensee's knowledge is a violation of this Agreement.

3. Copyright. APS Licensed Journal(s) and their contents are copyrighted by the APS and subject to all applicable copyright, database protection, and other rights of APS as copyright owner and publisher.

4. Disclaimer of warranties.

a. The APS has made and will make reasonable efforts to ensure that APS Licensed Journal(s) are complete and accurate. However, the APS does not warrant their completeness or accuracy, and does not warrant that the licensee's use of APS Licensed Journal(s) will be uninterrupted or error-free, or that the results obtained will be useful or will satisfy the licensee's requirements.

b. The APS warrants that it is entitled to grant the license granted in this agreement, but makes no other warranties or representations of any kind expressed or implied.

c. The licensee will be permitted to attempt to access APS Licensed Journal(s) at any time. The APS, however, will not be liable for any delay, down time, or other failure of performance, but will use reasonable efforts to correct any materials performance problem brought to its attention.

d. The APS will not be liable for incidental, consequential, or any other damages arising out of or in connection with the license guaranteed hereunder. In no event will the total aggregated liability of the APS for any claims, losses, or damages arising under or out of a termination of this agreement or the licenses granted hereunder, whether in contract, tort or otherwise, without limitation due to negligence, exceed the total amount paid by licensee to the APS for the license during the license year in which such claim, loss or damage occurred. The foregoing limitation of liability and exclusion of certain damages shall apply regardless of the success or effectiveness of other remedies.

e. The licensee assumes the sole responsibility for all use of APS Licensed Journal(s) and agrees to indemnify and hold the APS harmless from any liability or claim of any person arising from such use.

5. General.

a. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes any prior communication between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

b. The licensee may not assign or transfer his or her rights under this Agreement.
